**Where do cars stop?**

*Cars stop at the traffic lights.*

**Should the teacher start the lesson early, late or on time?**

*The teacher should start the lesson on time.*

**Are there many foreigners in your town?**

*Yes, there are many foreigners in my town.*

**Would you like to marry a foreigner? Why?**

*Yes, I'd like to marry a foreigner. Because I would like to live abroad.*

**Have you ever felt lonely although you weren't alone?**

*Yes, I've felt lonely, although I weren't alone.*

**Why are foreigners sometimes lonely?**

*Foreigners are sometimes lonely because they have no one to talk to when they live in a foreign country.*
